Day 1 Monday, October 19 - Depart for London

We depart USA for our overnight flight to London.

Day 2 Tuesday, October 20 - London (D)

Upon arrival at London Heathrow Airport, we will be greeted by our driver who will take us to our hotel for check-in. Remainder of the day free to explore London before meeting for our Welcome Dinner. Overnight in London at the Bailey's Hotel.

Day 3 Wednesday, October 21 - London (B|L|D)

Today we have a full day guided tour of London including **Tyburn Convent**, the **Houses of Parliament**, **Westminster Abbey**, and the **Tower of London**. Return to hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 4 Thursday, October 22 - London (B)

The day is yours to explore the marvelous city of London and its wonderful sites such Buckingham Palace, the British Museum, Kensington Gardens/ Palace, Hyde Park, St. Paul's Cathedral, Harrod's, London Eye and more. Lunch and dinner on your own. Overnight in London.

Day 5 Friday, October 23 - Norfolk (B|L|D)

Today we depart London to visit the **Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham**. Established in 1061 when Richeldis de Faverches was asked by the Virgin Mary to build a replica of where the Annuciation occurred. Walsingham became one of the greatest Shrines in Medieval Christendom. Holy Mass. Rest of the afternoon free to enjoy the town of Walsingham. Check into the Pheasant Hotel in Norfolk. Dinner and overnight in Norfolk.

Day 6 Saturday, October 24 - Lincoln (B|D)

After breakfast, we depart for Lincoln and the opportunity to walk in the footsteps of those who participated in England's greatest religious revolt (1536), the **Pilgrimage of Grace**. We will visit two examples of Norman architecture, the small parishes in Pocklington and Nunburnholme. Holy Mass. This after-

noon we check into the Petwood Hotel. Dinner at the hotel.

Day 7 Sunday, October 25 - York (B|L)

Today we will visit the **St Margaret Clitherow House** in York. One of the few women martyred for her faith, St. Margaret Clitherow was condemned to death for harboring priests in her small home in the York Shambles neighborhood. Holy Mass. We will then visit **The Bar Convent**, England's oldest living convent (1686). The chapel features a relic of St. Margaret of Clitherow's hand and a priest hiding hole. Dinner on your own and overnight in York.

Day 8 Monday, October 26 - York (B|D)

This morning we're off to the ruins of **Rievaulx Abbey**, destroyed in the widespread Dissolution of the Monasteries by order of Henry VIII. Later, we visit York Minster, built in the early 1100's. York's cathedral church is one of the finest medieval buildings in Europe, featuring beautiful Gothic architecture. We will attend evensong in the church's choir. Dinner at a local English pub. Back to our hotel for overnight.

Day 9 Tuesday, October 27 - Birmingham & Stratford-upon-Avon (B|L)

Today we will visit the **Maryvale Institute**, home of St. John Henry Newman after his conversion to Catholicism from Anglicanism. This afternoon we visit the **Birmingham Oratory**. The Oratory, founded by St. John Henry Newman in 1848, began at Maryvale but moved to its present site in 1852. Depart for Stratford-upon-Avon. Check in the Indigo Stratford Hotel before evening on your own.

Day 10 Wednesday, October 28 - Worcestershire (B|D)

Today we visit **Harvington Hall**, a moated English manor house with the largest number of surviving priest hiding holes, which was constructed by Sir William Owen. Holy Mass in the chapel. Return to Stratford-upon-Avon and the rest of the afternoon free before our Farewell Dinner.
